Public invited to review I-215/Barton Road Interchange plans

The Draft Environmental Document is now ready for public review and comment.

Open House Public Hearing:

GRAND TERRACE, CA – San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG), in cooperation with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), the City of Grand Terrace, and the City of Colton propose to improve the Interstate 215/Barton Road interchange. The proposed project is located primarily in the City of Grand Terrace and partially in the City of Colton in San Bernardino County. The project will accommodate the widening of I-215 and realign the on- and off- ramps and local streets to improve traffic flow.

The Draft Environmental Document is now completed and ready for public review and comment. The public hearing will give people an opportunity to talk to Caltrans and SANBAG staff about design features before a final design is selected. There are three “Build” alternative designs being evaluated, as well as the “No-Build” option. Large detail maps of the alternatives will be on display for the public to review, along with the Draft Initial Study/Environmental Assessment document. These documents are also available to review at SANBAG’s office, Grand Terrace Library and City Hall, Colton Library and City Hall, Caltrans in San Bernardino, or on the SANBAG project website: http://www.sanbag.ca.gov/projects/interchange_barton.html.

Comments and concerns should be submitted in writing on comment cards or via email by the closing date of December 30, 2013. Comments will be recorded and the design team will review and consider each comment before a final decision is made.
