Adopted by San Bernardino County voters in 1989, Measure I is a major source of revenue for transportation improvements in the City of Loma Linda. This 20-year half-cent sales tax has provided nearly \$4 million for Loma Linda’s streets and roads during the first 17 years. Local officials make decisions about the allocation of these funds.

Additional Measure I funds -- a total of \$1 billion -- have been pooled by all of the cities and unincorporated areas in the valley region of San Bernardino County. These pooled funds support freeway improvements, Metrolink trains, Omnitrans subsidies for elderly and disabled riders, major streets that serve as transportation arteries, ridesharing programs, landscaping and traffic management. Measure I clearly is working for the City of Loma Linda!

Measure I and Loma Linda: Progress in Transportation

Measure I funds received each year by the City of Loma Linda are designated for local streets and roads. Some of these projects include:

- Pavement rehabilitation of Mt. View Avenue, 1998-2002, 2006-07 (\$760,271)
- Pavement rehabilitation of Barton Road, 1992-94 (\$723,184)
- Slurry seal of various streets 1998-99, 2003-07 (\$627,091)
- Pavement reconstruction of Anderson Street, Barton Road to Stewart Street, 2000-01 (\$356,000)
- Citywide pavement rehabilitation and striping, 2003-07 (\$312,392)
- Pavement rehabilitation of Barton Road, New Jersey Street, Orange Street, Mound Street and La Mar Road, 2003-04 (\$277,291)
- Bridge replacement at Beaumont Ave., 2006-07 (\$193,100)
- Pavement rehabilitation and reconstruction of University Avenue, Barton Road to Campus Street, 2002 (\$190,000)
- Pavement maintenance, citywide, 1996-97 (\$160,629)
- Street rehabilitation in north central neighborhood, 1998 (\$149,370)
- Bridge widening at Beaumont Avenue, 2005 (\$146,171)
- Improvements to Mt. View Avenue overpass, 1993 (\$29,640)
- Bridge widening at Mt. View Avenue, 2005 (\$1,100)
