Adopted by San Bernardino County voters in 1989, Measure I is a major source of revenue for transportation improvements in the county’s unincorporated area in the North Desert. This 20-year half-cent sales tax has provided more than \$19 million for this area during the first 18 years. Local officials make decisions about the allocation of these funds. In the North Desert area, 65 percent of the funds are designated for regional highways and major streets, 30 percent goes toward local streets and roads and five percent is used to offset Barstow Area Transit fares for elderly and disabled passengers. Measure I clearly is working for the North Desert area!

Measure I and the North Desert: Progress in Transportation

Of the Measure I funds received each year by the San Bernardino County North Desert area, **95 percent** is used for improvements to streets that function as major arteries in the region, as well as local city projects. Some of these projects include:

- Rehabilitation and asphalt overlay of National Trails Highway, 1992-2006 (\$1,419,457)
- Resurfacing and traffic signal installation on Main Street, 1992-2000 (\$1,322,833)
- Rehabilitation and asphalt overlay of Newberry Road, 1992-2007 (\$1,301,649)
- Rehabilitation and asphalt overlay of Irwin Road, between Route 58 and Ft. Irwin Road, 2000-04 (\$1,107,033)
- Widening, intersection construction and rehabilitation of Baker Road., 2000-01 (\$654,742)
- New signal, drainage and asphalt overlay of Trona Road, 1993-2002 (\$647,076)
- Rehabilitation of Community Boulevard, 2007-08 (\$600,000)

- Resurfacing and drainage on Kelbaker Road, 1992-94, 2000 (\$484,647)
- Rehabilitation of Santa Fe Avenue, 2001-02 (\$390,146)
- Improvements to Lenwood Road, 1992 (\$264,002)
- Asphalt overlay of Minneola Road, 2002-03 (\$213,433)
- Widen and overlay of Rimrock Road, 1999-2001 (\$168,799)
- Resurfacing of Kelbaker Road, 2007-08 (\$120,000)
- Asphalt overlay of Essex Road, 2003-04 (\$110,837)
- Resurfacing of Guffs Road 2007-08 (\$90,000)

The remaining **five percent** of Measure I funds are designated for public transit. The North Desert area supports the Barstow Area Transit with funding for operational expenses, which allows elderly and disabled passengers to ride at lower rates. During the past 17 years, this area’s contributions have totaled \$731,471.
