

MATS Needs Assessment Web Tool

The MATS web tool is an online portal and Geographic Information System (GIS) mapping tool that was developed to solicit stakeholder input in identifying transportation issues and needs for consideration by the project team during the study. Information

Click on a dot to see what information was obtained during the stakeholder meetings. If additional information would be helpful to the project team, please create another dot at the same location to provide additional detail.

Zoom

Double click to zoom into an area or use the plus/minus buttons on the right of the map to zoom in or out on the map.

Yellow vs. Green Dots

Yellow dots indicate locations where information was obtained at focus stakeholder meetings. Green dots are additional comments that have been added through the interactive map feature.

Adding Dots

On the top left of the screen (under the Esri World Geocoder search bar) is an icon with a piece of paper and a pencil. Click on that icon, and then click on the green MATS Comments template that pops up. To add a comment to the map, click on your location of concern to add a new green dot with your additional comments. Please note it is advised to zoom in as much as possible before placing dots to ensure placement closest to your location of concern. Once a dot is added, it cannot be deleted to prevent users from deleting information provided by other users.

Background

The initial view of the map uses an aerial image with labels. More information appears on the map as the zoom level is increased. The background of the map can be changed by using the basemap gallery that is located on the top right of the screen. On the blue Mountain Area Transportation Study Web Map bar, there are three icons on the right. The far right icon represents the basemap gallery, which can be used to toggle between different views.
